

FGM/C Safeguarding Pathway

For Educators within the Kindergarten to Grade 12 School System

A student discloses that they have undergone female genital mutilation/ cutting (FGM/C)

A student discloses that they are at risk of female genital mutilation/cutting (FGM/C)

Refer to the FGM/C Risk Assessment and Intervention Tool Communicate to the student your responsibilities to report abuse and confidentiality limits

Student is under 18 or vulnerable adult

Student is over 18



- a) Follow your Duty to Report protocol for cases of child sexual abuse.
- b)Contact Child Protection Services. Check your province for the age at which Child Protection Services needs to be contacted. Child Protection Services will initiate a multi-agency safeguarding response.
- c) If FGM/C happened in Canada Child Protection Services must contact law enforcement. This is now a criminal investigation.

Is there an immediate threat or danger to the individual's physical/mental health or life?



No

- a) Follow your Duty to Report protocol.
- b) Connect the student with the school counsellor to assess the threat.
- c) Call law enforcement if necessary.
- d) If needed create a safety plan with the student.
- e) Determine if there is a connection to forced marriage. If Yes, refer to appropriate resources. https://travel.gc.ca/assistance/emergency-info/forced-marriage

Do they have any siblings at risk of FGM/C?



No



- a) Review FGM/C Risk Assessment & Intervention Tool if possible **OR**
- b) Share information with multi-agency partners to initiate Duty to Report response.
- a) Connect the student with the school counsellor for mental health and resource support
- b) If needed, create a safety plan with the student
- c) Connect them to End FGM Canada Network for additional vetted FGM/C resources. www.endfgm.ca

FOR ALL STUDENTS

- a) Continue clear communication with the student; constantly informing them of what responses are being taken and why
- b) Document all discussions and actions with the student
- c) Explain FGM/C is illegal in Canada.

If a student appears to have been recently cut or you believe she is at imminent risk, act immediately.

Call Child Protection Services and/or 911

REMEMBER: Mandatory reporting is only one part of safeguarding against FGM/C and other abuse.
